Citizen Lake Awareness and Monitoring (CLAM) Training for Volunteer Lake Monitors

The Ohio Lake Management Society is offering a free training session for anyone who wants to perform routine water quality monitoring on their lake, reservoir or pond. The training will be held on Saturday, March 20, 2010 from 10am – 3pm at Stark County Park District's Sippo Lake Marina in Perry Township (5300 Tyner St. NW, Canton, OH 44708). There is no fee for the training, but pre-registration is required. Space is limited to 20 people. You will be given a Lake Monitoring Kit that includes a Secchi Disk (used to measure water clarity) and other items needed to perform the monitoring tasks. By measuring water clarity, you can detect changes in water quality over a season or over a period of years. After the training, you will be eligible to apply for Ohio EPA's Level I Qualified Data Collector (QDC) status. You will also learn how to enter the data into an online data entry program that tracks the information and generates summary reports and graphs for data on your lake.
